COLLAGEN - MASSON'S TRICHROME STAIN(TRI) PURPOSE: Used to differentiate between collagen and smooth muscle in tumors, and the increase of collagen in diseases such as cirrhosis. Routine stain for liver and kidney biopsies. PRINCIPLE: As the name implies, three dyes are employed selectively staining muscle, collagen fibers, fibrin, and erythrocytes.

Masson's trichrome is a three-colour staining protocol used in histology. The recipes evolved from Claude L. Pierre Masson's original formulation have different specific applications, but all are suited for distinguishing cells from surrounding connective tissue. Most recipes produce red keratin and muscle fibers, blue or green collagen and bone, light red or pink cytoplasm, and dark brown to black cell nuclei. The trichrome is applied by immersion of the fixated sample into Weigert's iron hemat

How to troubleshooting Masson's Trichrome staining?

Trichrome staining is a histological staining method that uses two or more acid dyes in conjunction with a polyacid.Staining differentiates tissues by tinting them in contrasting colours. It increases the contrast of microscopic features in cells and tissues, which makes them easier to see when viewed through a microscope.. The word trichrome means "three colours".

The Masson's trichrome stain combines three dyes and is primarily used to reveal the presence of collagen. With this method, collagen stains green and the cytoplasm of cells stains red or purple. The third stain is usually a nuclear counterstain like hematoxylin. Stomach 200x

Multi-step techniques include methods such as the Masson's trichrome, which is used to differentiate between smooth muscle fibres and collagen, or to demonstrate a change in the amount of collagen present. Other methods, such as Lendrum's Picro-Mallory may be used to demonstrate fibrin in sharp contrast to erythrocytes and other tissues.

StainsFile - Stain theory - Trichrome stains

To evaluate collagen expression, samples were stained by the Masson trichrome technique (trichrome stain kit [modified Masson's]; ScyTec Laboratories, Inc., Logan, UT, USA) . Additionally, skin specimens were stained with toluidine blue to visualize mast cells, and the stained skin tissues were microscopically evaluated following conventional procedures.

Masson's trichrome. This is often used to stain connective tissue. Tri-chrome - means the technique produces three colours. Nuclei and other basophilic (basic-liking) structures are stained blue, cytoplasm, muscle, erythrocytes and keratin are stained bright-red. Collagen is stained green or blue, depending on which variant of the technique is used.

5µ paraffin sections of neutral buffered formalin fixed tissue are suitable. Other fixatives are likely to be satisfactory. Trichrome stains often benefit from Bouin's fluid, formal sublimate or B5 fixation. If formalin is used, secondary fixation of sections with Bouin's fluid at 56°C for an hour will improve staining.

Stainsfile - Lillie's trichrome

A more chronic measure of the role of cardiac angiogenesis is the Masson's trichrome stain of the area of cardiac injury. Specifically, Masson's trichrome utilizes three stains to selectively identify muscle, collagen fibers, and fibrin. As illustrated in Figure 78.3, the fibrotic area is stained blue, indicating the area at risk.

Masson's trichrome is a classical method of visualization with several variants. The nuclear dye can be Masson's hemalum or several hematoxylin solutions. The cytoplasmic dye is fuchsine. An aniline-derived dye allows the differentiation of collagen fibers (Figure 3).
