The Dyadic Adjustment Scale (DAS) aims to assess the degree of harmony or overall adjustment of the partners in a relationship. Professor Spaniel, responsible for this questionnaire, noted that: “To measure the dyadic adjustment of a relationship based on dimensions such as the possible differences between the couple, tensions, the presence of anxiety in the relationship and its intensity, the degree of satisfaction, cohesion and ease or difficulty in reaching agreements.”.

Description of Measure: A 14-item scale designed to measure relationship satisfaction. The RDAS is a revised version of the original Dyadic Adjustment Scale (Spanier, 1976 –see this website for information on the original). The revised version offers improved psychometric properties, is shorter, and includes only 3 of the original 4 subscales:

The five subscales measure Communication, Romanticism-Sexuality, Conflict Solving, Social Support, and Acceptance of Differences. Findings and Results: The Communication subscale has a six-factor structure and explains 64.2% of the total variance.

Development of the Dyadic Relationship Scale

Dyadic Adjustment Scale (DAS), the Love Attitudes Scale, and a brief self-esteem measure were administered to 57 dating couples recruited in the spring and fall of 1986 at a large southwestern 95 Journal of Marriage and the Family university. Subjects received either psychology course credit or a \$5 payment for participation.

A Generic Measure of Relationship Satisfaction

Questionnaires measuring family relationships for use in—

This paper presents a new short-form scale for use by clinical workers and researchers in measuring the degree or magnitude of a problem in the sexual component of a dyadic relationship, as seen by the respondent. The scale was designed for use in repeated administrations at periodic intervals in order.

A Short-Form Scale to Measure Sexual Disorder in Dyadic—

The FAM-III consists of three forms: the General Scale examines overall family health; the Dyadic Relationship Scale examines how a family member views his or her relationship with another family member; and the Self-Rating Scale allows each person to rate his or her own functioning within the family.

Another useful measure of relationship functioning and coping is the Emotional/Intimacy Disruptive Behavior Scale (EIDBS). 91 Originally developed to measure the relationship satisfaction of 74 dyads during an illness episode of lupus, the EIDBS measures the extent to which care partners withhold or distort information about their own symptoms and feelings to protect their partner from worrying.

The dyadic OPTION scale is acceptable and comprehensible by both clinicians and public respondents. Cognitive debriefing adapted and refined an existing scale and provided confidence that the core constructs of the scale (perceived involvement in decisions making) were understood.

The Dyadic Coping Inventory (DCI) The Dyadic Coping Inventory (DCI) was created by Bodenmann (2008) and is slightly different from the other scales mentioned in this article in that it was specifically developed to be used within close relationships, for when one or both partners are experiencing stress.
