Qualitative data analysis can be divided into the following five categories: 1. Content analysis. Discourse Analysis Defined Whereas other areas of language study might focus on individual parts of language—such as words and phrases (grammar) or the pieces that make up words (linguistics)—discourse analysis looks at a running conversation involving a speaker and listener (or a writer's text and its reader).

Discourse analysis is a qualitative method of analysis, which explores the meanings produced by language use and communication, the contexts and processes of these meanings and practices caused by these meanings. Discourse analysis aims to perceive and categorize various meaning-making processes, networks and practices from the data.
